Successful applicants will receive a **full-tuition scholarship** applicable to select bachelor's degree in accounting, business administration, criminal justice and information technology or any Strayer University master's degree (excluding the Jack Welch Management Institute).

Newly admitted first-time bachelor's students are eligible for this scholarship. Previously conferred bachelor's degrees are not permitted. Newly admitted first-time master's students are eligible.




Selection criteria include previous work or interest in **improving the applicant's surrounding community**.

- Can commit to completing degree coursework and fellowship requirements without taking off more than one quarter at a time
- Meet **Strayer University admission requirements**
- Are a newly admitted bachelor's or master's degree-seeking student
- Bachelor's applicants only:
 - Are a high school graduate or equivalent
 - Graduated with a 3.0 or higher GPA
- Master's applicants only:
 - Successfully completed a bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited institution
 - Graduated with a 3.5 or higher GPA
