

CRJ 440 – Terrorism and Antiterrorism

Course Description

This course exposes the student to the various forms of terrorism. Explanations of terrorism from a theoretical and sociological perspective are reviewed as causal effects of past, current, and new forms of terrorist behavior. Operational responses to terrorism are discussed, with special emphasis on the role of homeland security.

- 5. Describe policy and tactical approaches in mitigating terrorism activities and their networks in a connected world.

- 7. Identify the role of the Department of Homeland Security and its role in responding to terrorist activity.
- 8. Describe the role of law enforcement and constitutional issues in a homeland security context.
- 9. Use technology and information resources to research issues in terrorism and antiterrorism.
- 10. Write clearly and concisely about terrorism and antiterrorism using proper writing mechanics and APA style conventions.
